D.14. NOSE JOB/RHINOPLASTY

Rhinoplasty, commonly known as a nose job, is a surgical procedure aimed at reshaping or reconstructing the nose for cosmetic or functional reasons. It can enhance the appearance of the nose, correct structural deformities, or improve breathing difficulties.

Types of Rhinoplasty

1. Cosmetic Rhinoplasty: Focuses on improving the appearance of the nose by altering its size, shape, or proportions.

2. Functional Rhinoplasty: Aims to improve breathing by correcting structural issues such as a deviated septum or nasal obstructions.

3. Revision Rhinoplasty: Performed to correct or improve the results of a previous rhinoplasty surgery.

Procedure Overview

•Consultation: A careful consultation with a qualified plastic surgeon is crucial to discuss goals, medical history, and potential outcomes.

Anesthesia: The procedure is typically performed

under general anesthesia.

·Incision: Incisions can be made either:

• Open Rhinoplasty: An external incision across the columella (the tissue between the nostrils) is used, allowing for better visibility and access.

• Closed Rhinoplasty: All incisions are made inside the nostrils, resulting in no visible scarring.

•Nasal Reshaping: The surgeon will reshape the bone and cartilage as needed to achieve the desired outcome. This may involve removing, adding, or rearranging nasal structures.

•Closing the Incisions: The incisions are closed with sutures, and a splint or packing may be placed inside or outside the nose to support it during healing.

Recovery

• Initial Recovery: Patients can expect swelling, bruising, and some discomfort in the first week. Pain medication is typically prescribed.

•Splint Removal: A splint or packing may be removed after a week, but swelling can take several weeks to subside fully.

Activity Restrictions: Strenuous activities, including exercise and heavy lifting, should be avoided for a few weeks.
