

- •Scarring: While the surgeon aims to minimize visible scarring, some scars may remain, and their visibility can vary based on skin type and healing.
- •Complications: Potential risks include infection, bleeding, changes in eyelid sensation, and asymmetry.
- Asymmetry: There is a risk of uneven results, but experienced surgeons aim for balance and symmetry.
- Hematoma: Rarely, patients may have hematoma and that it may be needed to go back to the operating room to discharge and clean the hematoma.
- Nerve Damage: Rarely, patients may experience temporary or permanent changes in sensation in the forehead or scalp area.
